He will focus on two areas, Crymych and Maenclochog exploring in detail the independent operators which worked throughout these villages. In the chapters on Crymych the author details the histories of three larger independents and one smaller entity. The three larger are: David John Jones, Edwards Brothers and Midway Motors (formerly Rees & Phillips). The smaller, and short-lived operator featured is

Frenni Coaches (Beardwell & Collins). The pages describing the bus scene in Maenclochog cover three early pioneers in the region: Arthur Williams of Maenclochog, Ivor Williams of Trelech and Morgan Brothers of Llanfyrnach and their companies' progression. Softback.

Bullocks Coaches of Cheadle in Cheshire has been one of the North West's premier operators for over 90 years. Ralph senior started his business in the early 20s when a chance sighting of undelivered milk churns, due to a rail strike, caught his imagination and so began the Bullock enterprise. Early buses followed quickly for local workmen's commutes as well as day-trips at weekends. Carl Jarman, who has lived in Cheadle all his life, who joined the firm as an apprentice engineer straight out of school helped bring the business to life, as only a local could. Bullocks Coaches is still owned entirely by the Bullock family and their red, maroon and white livery can be seen throughout the UK and even into Europe. Together with two friends, Carl Jarman takes the reader through the history of this unique company from its creation right up to the present day. A4 softback, 80 pages.

A LIFETIME ON THE BUSES

Covering almost half a century, this is the story of one man's, slightly unusual, career in the transport industry. From working in the home counties with the largest bus operator in the country, to employment with one of the legendary family Independent operators in Yorkshire, the narrative traces the contrast between large and small in the bus industry, at the same time following in parallel the development of two major enthusiasts' organisations over the last 40 years, namely the Doncaster Omnibus & Light Rail Society and the British Trolleybus Society. A native of Sunderland, Jim Sambrooks moved to Hertfordshire aged 16 before commencing a career with London Transport. A subsequent move to Doncaster found him employed by a number of local operators, and allowed him to assist, alongside his paid work, in the development of The Trolleybus Museum at Sandtoft, where he can still be found, in retirement, keeping the wheels turning. 92 pages, softback.

Michael Yelton continues his study of Welsh municipal operators with this book on Aberdare. It covers the trams and trolleybuses of the early years through to the motor bus days. Aberdare has been little written about, although there has been some interest in the unusual early trolleybus operation, but nothing so far put forward on that system has been compiled after access to all the many relevant records, until now. Like other Welsh municipalities, the services revolved around the shifts of the local coal mines. The story ends with the local government reorganisation in 1974.

RIBBLE UNDER NATIONALISATION

Ribble Motor Services was formed in 1919 with its headquarters based in Preston. During the 1920s and 1930s the company rapidly expanded with the takeover of many smaller operators. The Ribble family grew to be one of the largest bus operators in the country and at its peak its operating area stretched all the way from Carlisle in the north to Merseyside. In this book Mike Rhodes outlines the services and vehicles operated by Ribble, and its subsidiaries, following the formation of the National Bus Company on 1st January 1969 through to its eventual takeover by Stagecoach on 21st April 1989. Profusely illustrated the book looks at each of Ribble's geographical operating areas in turn and records how established route patterns were radically changed with the advent of minibuses in the post-deregulation era. Ribble was slimmed down to nearly half its original size when the operations were taken over by Cumberland Motor Services and the Merseyside.

the Cumbria operations were taken over by Cumberland Motor Services and the Merseyside Operations passed to the North Western Road Car Company in 1986 making it easy pickings for one of the expanding operators to buy out, which is exactly what occurred and eventually Ribble was consigned to history.

HERE COMES THE EDEN

This book celebrates 90 years of Eden Bus Services. Mention that name to anyone above a certain age in Bishop Auckland, and thoughts turn to immaculately presented red and ivory buses, crewed by cheery staff operating a reliable and punctual bus service, in all weathers. Indeed, it is often said, 'The Eden always got through!' Though The Eden was sold to North East Bus (the parent company of United) in 1995, and the name faded away under the corporate image of Arriva, the name 'The Eden' was rescued by Graeme Scarlett, a Shildon businessman who drove for The Eden in the 1970s. Consequently, Eden buses still ply the streets of Bishop Auckland as though nothing happened, and even running out of the garage established in West Auckland, by the Summerson Brothers in the 1930s. This book records the history of this plucky little independent bus operator, and will bring to the attention of bus enthusiasts everywhere the fortunes of The Eden.

The Pontypridd Urban District Council transport undertaking was much better known than many of the other small municipal operators in the South Wales valleys, even though most of its routes were short and local. Commencing with horse trams in 1882, electric trams and later trolleybuses were also operated as well as the motor buses. This book provides an overview of the development of the system and is supported by a wide selection of illustrations, a trolleybus and motor bus fleet list and maps and route details.

This book provides a comprehensive history of this fascinating operator based in rural South Oxfordshire. The book covers the bus operations of Kemps between 1929 and 1955 when they became Chiltern Queens Bus Services.

The company ran as Chiltern Queens until 2002 when the company came in to financial difficulties. It was at this point that Keith Horseman from Horseman Coaches Ltd got involved and took control of their affairs. The initial intention was to keep the Chiltern Queens name for a further two years but this was not meant to be. Written by Laurie James and John Whitehead, this large format hardback book has 176 pages with over 250 colour and black and white illustrations plus comprehensive fleet details, route maps, garage and staff details and much more.

Stevensons of Uttoxeter Ltd in 1971, until by the late 1970s there were over forty vehicles in the fleet. This publication has been written as a lasting tribute to a highly regarded and much-missed family company in order to celebrate the 90th anniversary of its founding, which occurred in August 2016.

This long-awaited history of NCB explains the connection with Ringtons Tea, and then recalls the meteoric rise and equally dramatic end of one of the best-known coachbuilders of the post-war years. The involvement of the

Having reverted to the more traditional madder and white livery in 2010 this modern bus fleet presents a fine sight to the visitor and enthusiast alike. Mike Rhodes looks at the present day bus fleet through a series of photographs which depict all of the routes operated by each of the three garages. Extensive captions accompany each picture and many include additional information about the districts and buildings portrayed. The book also includes a brief history of the growth of local transport in Edinburgh, starting with the Edinburgh Street Tramway Co. in 1871, through to the present day. The book concludes with chapters which illustrate the Night Services. Bus Tours and the Tramway.

It is therefore a pictorial review, mainly in colour, of its development over the past 100 years and includes many previously unpublished photographs of the company's vehicles and operations. There is also brief reference to the expansion of the company which took place in 1997 with the takeover of the North Lancashire area from Ribble.



This volume in Neville Mercer's series on independent bus operators covers the western half of the old West Riding. providing historical accounts and extensive photographic coverage of more than 30 companies which ran

stage carriage services before deregulation. The 192 page book, the largest in the series so far, takes the reader from the remote villages of the Yorkshire Dales (where operators such as Alderson, Bounty, Cowgill, Hodder, Laycock, and Pennine eked out a living on the narrow margins of profitability) to the mining towns of the southern West Riding (and independents which operated high frequency inter-urban routes in competition with much larger bus companies and municipal transport departments). Well-known names including Hanson of Huddersfield and Baddeley of Holmfirth feature alongside lesser known enterprises operating in the southern coalfields. If Yorkshire independents are of interest this is a book for you.

VP468 ...36 Scottish Rebuilt Buses £17.00 £5.00



The end of WWII signalled a difficult period for bus operators. Many had struggled trying to maintain vehicles that were time expired. Parts were in short supply, maintenance had suffered and customary fleet replacement had all but

ceased. Some utility bodies were already deteriorating. and older vehicles in some cases could have their lives extended by fitting new bodies to durable chassis or transferring bodies from other vehicles. Original bodies were rebuilt or modified by converting for OMO, or modernising to coach standard. There was an urgent requirement for new buses. Sometimes there was a mismatch between the production of a chassis and the availability of its body, and a suitable pre-war body was reconditioned and fitted as a temporary measure. The next 20 years saw imaginative conversions carried out as Scottish operators rebuilt and re-bodied buses in order to modernise their fleets.

This book covers both sides of the business and is comprehensively illustrated in colour and black and white and includes full fleet details, and details of vehicle and operator acquisitions and disposals.

This was the era of enormous expansion in express services between the nation's towns and cities, and in the luxury touring and private hire market. A8445 Birmingham Buses, Trams & Trolleybuses in the Second World War £14.99



This book looks at the effects of the Second World War on public transport in the West Midlands. New regulations were introduced within days of Chamberlain's public announcement and buses. trolleybuses and trams had to conform

with new blackout regulations. Many single-deck buses were either commandeered by the War Department or converted to ambulances. Service reductions were made and significant damage to buildings and infrastructures presented a unique set of challenges for those tasked with keeping the West Midlands working. Air raids resulted in many routes being abandoned or changed as the inevitable reduction in fleet sizes put the public transport systems under even greater strain. Photographing public transport systems was forbidden during the war, but many enthusiasts continued to record history. Delving into his superb collection of wartime shots, renowned Midland's bus expert David Harvey offers a fascinating snapshot of theses buses' life during wartime.

A7885 Britain's Bendy Buses





Unlike other parts of the world, Britain was slow to start operating bendy buses and, despite the first ones appearing in service in Sheffield in 1978, it was not until 1985 that the next examples made their appearance. again in Sheffield. Somewhat surprisingly it

took a further thirteen years before bendy buses gained wider acceptance in the UK and began to appear in other towns and cities, with the largest number being operated in London from 2002. Never reaching their potential, however, their number failed to grow to any extent and only 808 were ever placed in service, with their withdrawal commencing as early as 2009. This book takes a detailed look at all the bendy buses operated in the UK and their after lives since their disposal by major operators and is profusely illustrated in colour. £14.99

A8601 British Independent Buses in 1980s



The 1980s was a decade of change in the bus industry. 1980 itself saw the Market Analysis Project (MAP), which, although primarily aimed at subsidiary companies of the NBC in an attempt to recast local bus networks and identify

which services would require local authority subsidy, did also involve independent operators. The Transport Act of 1985 paved the way for the deregulation of the bus industry, culminating in the dissolution of the National Bus Company and the enforced splitting up of the member companies and their eventual sale. Many independent operators continued as they always had. Some hitherto purely coach operators tried their hand as bus operators. Some well-known independent names disappeared. This book, featuring

previously unpublished images, is an attempt to illustrate the range of independent operators, both bus and coach, during this decade of upheaval.

A8541 Coaches in & Around Brighton



Brighton is famous for many things and coaching is one. During the summer months coaches from the four operators based in Brighton - Alpha, Campings, Unique and Southdown - would line up along Maderia Drive adjacent to the seafront with boards

along the sides of their coaches advertising excursions to a variety of locations in Sussex, Kent, Hampshire and Surrey. These attracted not only tourists in the area, but local people who would travel once or twice every week. These operators had premises in or around the town with an array of advertising potential exploited; Campings led the way with their Aquarium booking office to the right of the entrance to this famous attraction. This book relives coaching in Brighton from tours and excursions to private hires and contracts, taking in the heyday of the early 1960s through to the sad decline of traditional coaching in the 1980s. A8067 East London Buses- 21st Century



The start of the twenty-first century saw a flurry of bus activity at Stratford in East London to provide services to the Millennium Dome, this proved to be largely unneeded. Far more significant was the award of the Olympic Games to

London in 2012, with Stratford as the hub of the events and of subsequent regeneration. Following privatisation of London Transport in the 1990s. a small number of large operators had arisen, buying out many of the smaller companies that had won tendered services. The variety of liveries was also to disappear as Transport for London increasingly specified London red livery for its tendered buses. London bus travel has boomed, as a result of the popular Oyster card, Freedom passes and the fact that the population is rapidly growing. A nightlife economy has led to more routes running 24/7. With a wealth of previously unpublished images, Malcolm Batten observes what has changed in the East London bus scene since the turn of the century. A8559 East Yorkshire Motor Services £14.99



The legendary East Yorkshire Motor Services has been providing bus services in East Yorkshire since 1926. With buses painted in a distinctive livery of indigo blue and primrose yellow the company became famous for its 'Beverley Bar' shaped

double-deckers operated through Beverley's North Bar between 1933 and 1970. With distinctive destination indicators and the Willebrew ticket system, here was a company with its own very idiosyncratic way of doing things. The author has been an enthusiastic observer of the company since the mid-1950s and in that time has managed to take many photographs that bring back memories of how the company fared in the boom days of bus travel in the 1950s and 1960s. Most of these images have never been published before and will provide a fresh insight into the company. The



Beverley Bar roofs and the distinctive livery may have gone but EYMS seems proud of its history and is embracing the future with dignity.

A8702 Leyland's Big Cat Coaches £14.99 Ju



From humble beginnings building steam lawnmowers in the Lancashire town of Leyland, this company grew to become one of the largest vehicle manufacturers in the world. With ground-breaking ideas such as designing buses and coaches with

bespoke chassis rather than converted lorry chassis, Leyland vehicles were sold all over the world. Through acquisition and merger, the majority of British vehicle manufacturers ended up under the Leyland banner, resulting in the creation of the mighty British Leyland Motor Corporation, whose subsequent fall from grace has been widely documented elsewhere. This, the first in a series of books showcasing the products of the passenger division of Leyland since 1960, concentrates on single-deck coaches and includes such well-known 'big cats' as the Leopard, Tiger and Royal Tiger among others. It contains 180 photographs, most of which are in colour, all with informative text and captured when the vehicles were in their operating heyday.

A8752 London's Dart and Dart SLF £14.99



Launched in 1988, the Dennis Dart saloon became one of the most successful single-deck buses in the UK. Originally sold to London operators, provincial operators soon saw the success of the model and purchased

large numbers of these vehicles. Several different manufacturers produced bodywork for this new model. Going from strength to strength, a low-floor model was constructed in 1995, becoming known as the Dennis Dart SLF. Again, this model was purchased by many operators across the country, with the Plaxton Pointer and Alexander ALX200 body styles being the more popular choice. Large numbers of both the stepentrance and low-floor machines were taken into stock by London operators, both big and small. The Dart and Dart SLF became a worthy workhorse of the London bus network for over twenty-five years.

A8738 London's New Routemasters £14.99 Jun



Inspired by the AEC Routemaster, the New Bus for London, later renamed the 'New Routemaster', was the first bus specifically built for use in London since 1968, when the last Routemaster machines were constructed. Boris

Johnson wished for a new version of the Routemaster bus to be designed and built, subsequently launching a competition for the design of such a vehicle. Wrightbus gained the contract to build the vehicle, using the design submitted by the Heatherwick Studios. The first prototype was unveiled in December 2011, with the last examples being delivered to London six years later. 1,000 examples were built, and all gained registrations in a specially commissioned LTZ series. Sporting a dual-staircase and three doors, this vehicle has become a London landmark in its own right.

A9189 Lothian Buses- 100 Years & Beyond£14.99 Jun



As capital of Scotland, Edinburgh has always boasted a bus service to be proud of. The municipal operator survived deregulation and became part of the big bus groups that expanded rapidly throughout the UK. The company

transformed from Edinburgh Corporation Transport into Lothian Region Transport and subsequently Lothian Buses, with a wide network of routes expanding throughout not just Edinburgh, but the whole of the Lothian area. Most recently the company has split into a 'family' of operating groups not only providing core bus services in the city, East Lothian, Midlothian and West Lothian, but also a large range of city and out-of-town open-top tours and coach excursions. It also boasts a heritage fleet of old Edinburgh vintage vehicles as well as superbly restored London-liveried Routemasters available for private hires. Richard Walter looks at the Lothian Buses story.

A8672 Luton & District to

Arriva the Shires 1986-2000

Luton & District was formed in 1986, to operate the former southern depots of United Counties, it was sold by NBC to its employees in 1987 (a first), then sold again in 1994 to British Bus. It now forms part of Arriva, acquiring various local

companies on the way, with a mixture of vehicles and liveries. New purchases as well as many second-hand purchases made for an interesting fleet, which carried three liveries in various styles. A strong marketing department ensured many advert buses were operated. Arriva standard livery arrived in 1997. With a mix of busy urban routes and Green Line among its portfolio, this book features previously unpublished images from the former United Counties area.

A8674 Milton Kevnes Buses

£14.99 Jun



Designated as a new town some fifty years ago, Milton Keynes was designed for the car owner, but public transport has provided a vital link to many. The large shopping centre opened in 1979 became the focus point for both town

and country routes, with an underused bus station next to the new rail station a short distance away. United Counties provided the backbone of services until 1986 when it was replaced by Milton Keynes Citybus. Recast services at deregulation brought almost 100 minibuses to the area with bigger buses returning over the following decade, it then passed through several owners over the next fifteen years until coming under Arriva ownership. Independents now run several routes in the area with Stagecoach running services from its Bedford, Northampton and Kettering depots depots. National Express has a coachway located by the park and ride to provide further interest.

A8637 NBC Dual Purpose Vehicles



After the 1969 nationalisation, bus and coach companies had generally continued with their traditional liveries and, in 1971, it was decided the time had come to apply a corporate image to state-owned bus operations. The livery scheme would be a

simplification of the colours previously used. The livery of a bus would be one colour all over, later relived by a central 3-inch white line and vehicles designated as dual purpose or 'Local Coach' would use the base colour on the lower half and white above. The 'dual purpose' vehicle could be a bus fitted with comfortable seats, an older coach no long deemed suitable for full coach duties, or a new coach fitted with bus-style doors. With a wealth of unpublished images, Michael Hitchen looks at this interesting part of NBC fleet as it journeyed between the towns and cities across England and Wales, at a time when there was still plenty of variety and exceptions to the rule.

A8487 Stagecoach Beyond Scotland-The First Twenty Years





Keen to quickly expand during the 1980s, Stagecoach purchased three former National Bus Company subsidiaries during its sell-off in 1986/1987 to give it a foothold in the English bus market. Finding this move to be successful, the

company then set about a further expansion programme with the purchase of twenty-six more major, and several independent, companies to become Britain's largest bus operator and followed this with the acquisition of a number of Welsh companies. Looking further afield, Stagecoach then purchased some bus companies in Malawi, Kenya, Hong Kong and New Zealand to become a global operator. This book covers all of these activities and is an evocative look at the first twenty years of Stagecoach beyond Scotland.

A8742 Scottish Buses During Deregulation-Another View £14.99 Jun



In this book, Kenny turns his attention to some of the smaller operators to be found within Scotland at this time and features some of the many varied and interesting vehicles operated by these companies. This includes Graham's Bus

Service, Park of Hamilton, Argyll Coaches, AA Buses, Moffat & Williamson and Rapson. Many of the vehicles featured started life with one of the Scottish Bus Group subsidiaries and in later years many of these operators would either grow into larger operators or sadly cease trading. These photographs are complemented by a further selection of photographs of other vehicles operated by some of the larger operators covered in his earlier book.

A9127 Strathtay Scottish Buses

Strathtay Scottish was a product of the stateowned Scottish Bus Groups' attempts to prepare for deregulation and possible privatisation in the mid-1980s. It combined a part of Midland Scottish. based around Perthshire with a part of Northern Scottish based in Dundee and Angus. The Strathtay management tried to buy the company during the privatisation of the Scottish Bus Group, but were ultimately unsuccessful. The winner was The Yorkshire Traction Company based in Barnsley. and this was indeed the only case of a non-Scottish based company gaining a part of the Scottish Bus Group. Ultimately Stagecoach would force the company to abandon Perth, and eventually the Yorkshire Traction Group would itself be taken over by Stagecoach. An interesting tale of expansion. contraction and ultimately oblivion, combined with some fascinating pictures.

A9115 The McKindless Group

The McKindless bus company started off as a small operation of a few buses, a lorry and two coaches in 1987, and traded under the name of Chartered Coaches. Its aim was to provide school contracts and private hires, but it quickly

moved into local bus operation, spurred on by the problems suffered by it larger neighbour Central Scottish. The company would sell its services to Kelvin Central Buses in 1992, but restart again on a larger scale. The company ceased operation of its services abruptly at 1900 hours on Friday 19th February 2010. Many employees were not notified that the company was about to close, only discovering this when their shifts ended. With a fascinating array of previously unpublished photographs, this is the story of a family business that got out of its depth.

The National Rifle Association (NRA) was founded in the mid-19th century and was granted a Royal Charter of Incorporation by Queen Victoria in 1890. It was created for the encouragement of the Rifle Corps of the newly formed

Volunteer Movement and the promotion of rifle shooting throughout Great Britain. This would be accomplished by establishing a great Annual National Meeting, where marksmen could compete for valuable prizes and ensuring that the location was easily accessible to all comers over the developing railway network. Situated in Bisley, some 35 miles from London, the base of RNA had very little infrastructure and soon enough, the Council invested, buying land and providing permanent accommodation. The London and South Western Railway Company built a spur from Brookwood Station to accommodate the camp whilst the tramway was relaid to connect the camp and ranges. The original range layout still remains today in its basic form.

There was a marked increase in loads, speeds and reliability as the railways spread across the country from their cradle in the North West, with several thousands of miles of track being laid. Here, Anthony Dawson charts the rise and development of the steam locomotive in this crucial period in the development of the railways. Drawing on first-hand accounts, and using case studies based on specific classes of locomotive and their working replicas, this is a fascinating and well-illustrated insight into a period of engineering ingenuity and genius.

The world-famous Beyer, Peacock works of Gorton, Manchester, is remembered principally for its remarkable Beyer-Garratt articulated locomotives, which ran in forty-eight countries. The firm would also turn out

steam lorries and steam tram engines. Among the company's iconic domestic designs were the 4-4-0T condensing engines for the pre-electrified Metropolitan Railway in London, the narrow-gauge 2-4-0 tank engine that is synonymous with the Isle of Man and the stylish and powerful diesel-hydraulic Hymeks for British Railways' Western Region. Beyer, Peacock exported many of its 8,000 steam, diesel and electric locomotives all over the world and this book illustrates a variety of these throughout the company's 112-year existence, beginning in 1854.

A8557 Britain's Railways in the 1970s £14.99

The 1970s was a unique period for Britain's railways. Steam had not long been replaced by diesel traction, the West Coast Main Line electrification was well underway with new and more powerful locomotives, and the colourful

'rail-blue' livery projected an image of a new and altogether cleaner railway. Much of the railway infrastructure and complex track layouts of the steam era remained intact, freight traffic was plentiful and invariably passed through marshalling yards for sorting, and there were plenty of locomotives classes of various shapes and sizes, often regionally based, to pique the interest. As well as this, though, the seeds were being sown for an altogether different railway, one where locomotive standardisation was being pursued as a means of lowering fleet maintenance costs and one where track layouts were being simplified and streamlined to increase speed and reduce permanent way maintenance.

A8589 Class 26, 27 & 33 Locomotives



The 1955 British Rail modernisation plan identified a need for small powered lightweight diesel locomotives, and the Birmingham Railway Carriage & Wagon Company based in Smethwick in the West Midlands were awarded the

contract to build the Class 26, Class 27 and Class 33 locomotives. All were built with Sulzer engines, and the Class 26 and 27 locomotives were split between the Scottish, Eastern and Midland regions, before being concentrated north of the border. The Class 33 locomotives were built for the Southern Region. All three classes were comfortable on freight as well as passenger turns. The locomotives were built to last, with the Class 27s the first to be completely withdrawn in 1987 and the last Class 26 being taken out of service in 1993. Some Class 33 locomotives remain active on the main line. This book aims to show the three different classes at work and on shed, and also covers the classes into preservation.

A6174 Class 67 & 68 Locomotives



Class 67 was ordered by the newlyprivatised EWS as a 125mph replacement for elderly Class 47s on mail and charter trains. They were built by Alstom in Spain as sub-contractor to General Motors in America, the main

mechanical components being similar to the Class 66. Deliveries commenced in late 1999 and entered service the following year. The class has tended to be a victim of circumstance for much of its career. Work was found in the form of charter work, royal duties and some freight, while some were stored. The diesel legs of the Scottish Sleepers went over to 67 haulage, then more passenger work for Chiltern and other operators, however to a large extent they have now been replaced by new Class 68s once again leaving the 67 with a shortage of work. Class 67 and 68 Locomotives gives a brief history of the Class 67 locomotives and a pictorial record of their varied career so far, and looks at the new Class 68.

A8211 GB Railfreight £14.99 Jun

Formed in 1999, GB Railfreight was one of several new rail freight operators to appear after the privatisation and break-up of British Rail in the 1990s. After winning a contract to operate infrastructure trains for Railtrack in 2000 the company enjoyed a long period of rapid growth to become one of the UK's principle rail freight companies, later expanding into passenger operations. Today, with a fleet of over 100 locomotives, the company operates a wide and varied range of services across the UK. This book aims to take a look at the operations and fleet of this successful rail business.

A8443 Iberian Railways



Steam locos operated later in Spain and Portugal than in most other Western European countries, lasting until the mid-1970s. In 1974 steam in Portugal survived on the broad gauge main line from Oporto almost to the Spanish

frontier and operated up the beautiful Douro Valley, running alongside the river for most of its length. From this main line three branch lines ran into the hills, and all were very different both in terms of the landscape they inhabited and the trains that operated the services. Steam could still be found in Spain as late as 1977, on the Andorra-Escatron coal railway. With a wonderful collection of colour photography, George Woods documents the final years of steam on the railways of Portugal and Spain.

A4940 Industrial Locos & Rlys of North East £14.99



The industrial and minor railways of North East England are neglected topics deserving of greater attention. Following on from 'Industrial Locomotives &

Railways of Lancashire and Yorkshire, Gordon Edgar uses his excellent collection of photographs to explore these fascinating railways and their locomotives

A8898 London Rail Freight Since 1985 London's rail freight traffic is dictated by the geography of London. When railways first came to London, each line was built by a different company seeking to link their area to the capital. There was no through service from one side of London to the other, and indeed the railway companies were prevented from entering the central area of the City and West End. In order to transfer freight traffic from one company to another, the various railway companies made links to the orbital North London Railway, which ran from Broad Street station in the east to Richmond in the south-west, and also had a route into the east London docks. This book takes the freight routes around London geographically, in an anti-clockwise direction, starting in East London north of the Thames and ending in South-East London. It covers the period since 1985 and shows the various types of locomotives used, and freight traffic carried over this period.

A8740 NE Railways in the 1970s & 1980s £14.99 Jun John Carlson takes a new look at the north-eastern rail scene. Focusing mainly on the years 1975 to 1985, this collection of around 180 colour and black-and white-images, almost all previously unpublished, takes a look the regions railways in the 1970s and 1980s. Captured here are images that encapsulate intercity expresses at speed and rest, show freight being shunted and hauled in yards and on main lines, and portray the enthusiasts and passengers that photograph and ride them. During the 1970s and 1980s, the Western Region was undergoing change in both trains and equipment. On passenger services High Speed Trains worked alongside loco-hauled passenger trains and first generation DMUs, while in

the world of freight the last of the traditional vacuum-braked wagon load trains lingered into the 1980s to be replaced by the newly introduced Speedlink services. Semaphore signals were being replaced in Devon by new colour light signals. There was also a contrast between the three divisions with each having its own character. The London Division was busy with express and commuter traffic to and from Paddington and inter-regional freight traffic. The South Wales Division witnessed a procession of freight trains through Cardiff and Newport while DMUs and coal trains headed up and down the Valleys. The West of England Division experienced heavy aggregate trains from the Mendip guarries. sleepy West Country branch lines and the Summer Saturday trains full of holidaymakers.

A8571 South Devon Railway £14.99 Jun

On 21 May 1969 Dr Richard Beeching officially reopened the railway between Buckfastleigh and Totnes in South Devon as the Dart Valley Railway. This former GWR branch line had been closed by British Railways in 1962, although the passenger service had disappeared in 1958. The railway was only the fifth heritage railway in the country to be reopened and, though volunteers were involved, the owning company had shareholders and was run as a commercial undertaking. The author was one of those early volunteers who worked to make the railway physically fit to carry passengers again. Since then in the intervening fifty-odd years the line has had its highs and lows, has come close to closing, has been taken over by a registered charity and now seems to be much more assured in its future direction. Many of the images that follow have never been published before and give a fascinating insight into the early years of the infant heritage railway.

A8185 Eastern Region in the 70s & 80s

LMS engine No.5596 was constructed at the Queen's Park works of the North British Locomotive Co in Glasgow toward the end of 1934. As one of the 191

examples of the 'Jubilee' class, the engine entered traffic with the LMS railway in January 1935 and was allocated to Crewe. It was named Bahamas during its first service repair in June 1936. It subsequently operated from Preston, Camden, Willesden, Kentish Town and Derby prior to the outbreak of the Second World War. Indeed, its highest annual mileage was during 1939 when it achieved in excess of 72,000 miles during that year. 

On 16 January 1988 bus services in the Bexley area underwent enormous changes - long established routes were altered or absorbed into other routes and Sidcup Garage closed, while Bexleyheath Garage re-opened. Buses

and operators were changed and so began one of the most unsettled and colourful periods the area's bus network had known. The Bexley area routes had been put out to tender, and Selkent won 17 of the 20 routes, using a low cost subsidiary and operating a mixed fleet of buses. (both old and new) based at the re-opened garage at Bexleyheath. Things did not go smoothly from the start, leading to the eventual loss of three routes to Boro'line Maidstone within the first year. Bexley Buses in the Bexleybus Era takes a close look the area's buses and routes, from the relative stability of 1983, through the Bexleybus era and finishing with the loss of all the Bexleybus routes upon re tendering. In addition to Bexleybus, the operations and vehicles of all other operators in the area are covered.

The County of North Yorkshire evolved from the old North Riding of Yorkshire, expanding to take over a bit of the West Riding around the Selby area and the city of York itself. The area around Middlesbrough was lost to Cleveland for

a while, but has now been 'recaptured'. North Yorkshire has long been the meeting point of many major bus operators. United Automobile Services dominated the north, West Riding Automobile Services the south: West Yorkshire Road Car had services in Harrogate and the city of York, while East Yorkshire Motor Services came into York and Scarborough from its home territory. Privatisation and takeovers meant that municipal transport disappeared from North Yorkshire, but the result was that the county is today served by the country's four largest bus groups- Stagecoach, Arriva, First and Transdev. Britain's largest independent, East Yorkshire Motor

Preston Corporation Tramways was formed in 1904, later becoming Preston Corporation Transport Department. Electric trams, the majority of which were built in Preston, were operated until 1935. The first buses entered

service in January 1922. The department bought nothing but Leyland chassis until 1976. The first 'OPO' equipped buses were introduced in December 1968 and consisted of 15 Leyland Panthers. Preston was a staunch advocate of the Levland Titan and operated an assortment of PD1. PD2 and PD3

models over the years. A large fleet of Atlanteans was assembled between 1974 and 1983 and these formed the backbone of the fleet for many years. Following bus deregulation in 1986 the company fought a bitter battle with United Transport (Zippy) as both operators went toe-to-toe with large fleets of minibuses. Preston won the day as United Transport were absorbed by Ribble in 1988 until April 1993 when the company was sold to a management and employee consortium.

When British Rail decided to electrify the West Coast Main Line north of Crewe towards Scotland, a new class of electric locomotive was needed to work these services. 36 members of the Class 87 were built at Crewe Works from 1973

onwards and were an instant success. The first 35 members were standard locomotives, however the final member was fitted with an experimental thyristor control system, which resulted in it becoming the 87/1 subclass. All were initially used on passenger work, but they could also be found on freight workings. The whole class staved on West Coast workings throughout the BR era and into privatisation, with all members, except for 87101, passing to Virgin Trains. The sole Class 87/1 passed to the Railfreight sector of BR and would eventually find its way into EWS ownership: it was unfortunately scrapped in 2002. When their work on the West Coast was at an end. 21 found further use in Bulgaria and 3 would be preserved, with the balance being scrapped.

In September 1967 the last steam locos finished operations in the North East - the area where it had all begun 142 years before. The last trains ran from the engine sheds at Sunderland, Tyne Dock and West Hartlepool, and were hauling

coal from collieries to industrial sites, power stations and docks for export or transport by coaster to ports in the south of England. The traffic had hardly changed as the original railways were built to transport coal, only the distance the coal travelled was now greater. Even the means of moving coal had not changed greatly - most coal moved in trains of wagons capable of carrying 16 or 21 ton loads and some were hauled by 0.6.0. locos. This book of colour photographs shows scenes from the last two years of steam operations in and around Tyneside and Wearside, including locos in service with the National Coal Board at various collieries and the Doxford shipyard at Sunderland.



The Kings were the final development of the Churchward four-cylinder 4-6-0. stretched to the very limits of the loading gauge. Many people have asked why this, the premier Great Western Railway express passenger class, had not been

covered in the 'Book of' series when books had been devoted to the humble pannier tanks and the 'lesser' 4-6-0 classes. The answer lies partly in the mists of time - in the previous millennium when Irwell Press published Peto's Register on the Kings in 1995. Although it has stood the test of time quite well, it was thought the material should be dusted down. refurbished and re-invigorated with a generous helping of new pictures to take its rightful place at the head of the GWR 'Books of'. The Chairman of the Great Western wanted the most powerful express engines in the country, and the successors to the Castle were designed to achieve this. The Kings attracted much attention from the enthusiast community, and many column inches have been devoted to their workings.

Several of the lines featured within these pages were saved: the Welshpool & Llanfair, the Ffestiniog, the Talyllyn and, eventually when BR finally tired of running it, the Vale of Rheidol, form between them a core part of the narrow

gauge lines of North Wales that now attract tourists in their thousands, together with the Snowdon Mountain Railway. The Isle of Man Railway is also still with us, albeit much reduced, but the sizeable Welsh slate quarry systems were just too complicated and industrial to save; the English ironstone systems have also gone along with the industry they served. In Ireland, the Cavan & Leitrim, West Clare and County Donegal are all long closed but have short preserved lines on a part of their routes. This is a chance then to enjoy many of these lines and the myriad range of sturdy locomotives that worked them as they were, a couple when in the

early throes of their preservation, but most when they were in the final years of performing the job for which they were built.

BD846 Stratford upon Avon & Midland Junction Railway Volume 2



This is the second book on the Stratford-upon-Avon & Midland Junction Railway which was formed in 1909 by the amalgamation of three unsuccessful small railways, with a fourth being absorbed in the following year. This book

takes a look at the S&MJR, LM&SR, BR and MoD eras from 1909 to 2018. After the initial progress had been interrupted by the rigours of WWI. Britain's railways were then amalgamated into four large groups in 1923 and the S&MJR lost its identity after just 14 years of independence. The new owners, the London Midland & Scottish Railway, then developed the line as a useful cross-country freight artery, linking the west of England with London and the East Midlands. The formation of British Railways in 1948 brought inevitable economies, resulting in the withdrawal of all passenger services by mid- 1952. By 1967, all of the lines had been closed with the exception of the short length from Fenny Compton to the large Ministry of Defence establishment at Kineton, which remains open today.

Using hundreds of photographs, with several in colour and many hitherto unpublished, together with informative text and captions, they take the reader on a fascinating journey along the line, back through time from its earliest days until its closure to passengers in 1960.

A Pictorial Journey Through Time £30.00 It could be argued that the great Western or 'Gods' Wonderful Railway' was for many years the most famous railway in England. Much of the railway that we see today was the work of probably one of the greatest engineers

of his time Isambard Kingdom Brunel. The company was also served by locomotive engineers such as Gooch, Armstrong, Churchward, Collett and Hawksworth, who between them produced a series of locomotives that were well designed, elegant and powerful. Serving many holiday resorts of the south west, with trains such as 'The Cornish Riviera Express', the publicity department exploited to great effect that the 'Great Western' was the 'Holiday Line'. It is probably true to say that in the years before the 2nd world war the company was producing some of the most effective publicity material in England.

P8763 Narrow Gauge in the Somme Sector- Before. **During & After the First World War** £40.00



In this book the metre gauge networks established before WWI are examined. Then the build-up of light (60cm gauge) railways, initially mainly French but later British, in 1915 and 1916, is considered. with an assessment of the contribution

of these and the metre gauge lines to the war effort. With the major movements of the front line in this sector in 1917 and 1918, the response of the narrow gauge railways is considered chronologically as well as by area, in the context of overall railway policy and development. After the war the light railways contributed to the reconstruction of the devastated areas, and then in some places served the sugar beet industry. The metre gauge railways were rebuilt or repaired. The story is followed to the closure of the last of these railways in the 1960s.


